

Lists and Tables

Lists

Ordered List- a numeric list; requires using nested tags `` and ``

```
<ol>
  <li>Dogs</li>
  <li>Cats</li>
  <li>Bears</li>
</ol>
```

Will appear like this in browser:

1. Dogs
2. Cats
3. Bears

Attributes:

TYPE-numbers are the default, but you can use an *A* for Capital letters, *a* for lower case, *I* for Uppercase Roman Numerals and *i* for lowercase Roman. i.e. `<ol type="I">`
START-insert the start value; 1 is default.

Unordered List- a bulleted list

Use `` instead of ``

```
<ul>
  <li>Dogs</li>
  <li>Cats</li>
  <li>Bears</li>
</ul>
```

Will appear like this in browser:

- Dogs
- Cats
- Bears

Use the attribute TYPE to set bullet shape (disc, circle, square)

Tables

Using Tables for data – use nested tags <table>, <tr> (table row), and <td> (table data)

TABLE attributes

border-sets size of border

bordercolor-for a solid border; bordercolorright and bordercolorleft-for a shaded border

width-sets amount of space it takes up on page, can use pixels for a fixed width or % for a width as a percent of screen size.

align-use align=center to center table.
